Our Guest Minister: Rev. Forrest Gilmore is the Executive Director of Shalom Community Center, Inc, a shelter, resource center, and housing provider for people experiencing extreme poverty in Bloomington, IN. Forrest is also the Community Minister of the Unitarian Universalist Church of Bloomington. Prior to non-profit work, Forrest served as a parish minister in Unitarian Universalist congregations in Carmel, CA and Princeton, NJ. He is a graduate of Cornell University and Starr King School for the Ministry. Forrest made national news last summer when he was arrested dressed as a unicorn, protesting the presence of white supremacists at the local Farmers Market.



"Unicorns Against Fascism": Overt white supremacy is on the rise and considered the most dangerous terrorist threat in our country. How do we respond when we encounter it? How do we stay true to our values? How do we use joy and love to counter the fear and hate?

The Poor Peoples Campaign is a movement to [change the moral narrative](#) and demand that the interlocking injustices of systemic racism, poverty, ecological devastation, the war economy/militarism and the distorted moral narrative of religious nationalism all be ended, challenge the lie of scarcity

in the midst of abundance, and to lift the voices and faces of poor and low-wealth Americans and their moral allies with a new vision of love, justice, and truth for America that says poverty can be abolished and change can come.
